What is our Mission as a Disciple? July 9-10, 2016

Ultimately, our goal as a disciple is to know Jesus, love Jesus, serve Jesus, follow Jesus and lead others to Jesus. Hopefully as a disciple we understand just how essential the parish is in helping us to accomplish that mission. In this issue of the Discipleship Manual, we will take a brief look at what Jesus' mission is: how we work to accomplish that mission; and how we, as individual disciples, are involved in the relationship between our parish and our mission as disciples.

As we move forward, let's keep these questions in our mind and come back to them periodically to see how we are doing. Let's continue to be guided by the Holy Spirit into a deeper discipleship.

Why Do We Need to be Better Disciples?

Remember a few weeks ago when the question was asked; "Do I need the church to get to heaven?" We learned that the answer is "Yes." We need each other, we need the church! If we realize that this parish is the one to help us get to heaven, we must be honest and discern how we can better ourselves. If we improve ourselves as disciples, our parish will also naturally thrive and continue to lead more people to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Below is an honest list of some assessments at Our Lady of Charity Parish. We need to name where we are, so that we understand why we need to move forward as disciples. The following list is NOT a comprehensive one, but it names why we need to be reinvigorated in our faith, in our church, in our parish, and in our role as disciples.

1. We became Our Lady of Charity Parish in 2010.
2. Our school was closed in 2012. 3. Our long beloved Pastor retired in 2015.
4. Our feelings have been hurt.
5. Our population is aging.
6. Our involvement in ministry is dwindling.
7. Fewer younger families are involved.
8. Resources are more limited.

9. Change seems to be happening “all at once”... 1

0. It’s not always, “the way it used to be”...

11. “The new priest ...”

12. ... (What is on your list?)

The first disciples had these same feelings. They were merged with other communities, leaders came and went, they were challenged by change and were uncomfortable in their mission and new ideas of people like Saul of Tarsus. Yet, the Holy Spirit worked then, and the Holy Spirit continues to work today in Our Lady of Charity Parish.

In the midst of all of this, the disciples grew and shared their faith. We are living the same reality. Like the first disciples, we too should be questioning, learning, following, but most importantly growing. Each one of us needs to be a better disciple. Therefore, we need to go to the disciple-maker, Jesus. Let’s start being better disciples by going to Jesus more!

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Disciples are Merciful & Compassionate ... There is so much fear and hatred in the world today. Like the Good Samaritan each of us is being called to treat strangers with mercy & Compassion.

How Well Do We Know Jesus?

This year our Faith Formation Program will focus on ‘Knowing Jesus’, and as one of his disciples, each one of us needs to ask ourselves “**How Well Do I Know Jesus?**” Therefore our program will be focusing on the basic activities disciples do:

1. Disciples Pray
2. Disciples Worship
3. Disciples Share Faith/Evangelize/Participate in Mission
4. Disciples Grow

Our entire Faith Formation Program this year will focus on forming all of us as disciples in these primary areas.

Disciples Grow... and Change!

Our Parish is moving to a Family Faith Formation Model, so that every person in our parish is involved in teaching and handing on the faith. This will take place in two sessions each month. We need to be

honest about expectations. Disciples face challenges, (p. 2) and need to better themselves. Disciple training through Faith Formation means:

1. Disciple training through Faith Formation will take place one Sunday, and one Monday a month. (Details will follow...)
2. Anyone enrolled in Faith Formation is expected to attend Mass weekly.
3. Families are expected to participate in learning about their faith together. (Sunday program, watch for details to follow.)
4. Families, during the Monday night program, will be asked to accompany one another for a prayer experience, and all ages will be involved in learning about their faith.
5. Having a child enrolled in Catholic School does not mean the family is exempt from parish faith formation. We need to journey together (family/ parish family) no matter where a child attends school.
6. Ideally, First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation will be given when the family is ready for these sacraments, not necessarily based upon age.
7. Adult Disciples must be willing to share and teach faith at home as well as accompany young disciples at faith formation.

This is an exciting time and we are excited to grow together!

What Do Disciples Do?

Disciples participate in Jesus' mission! What is that? + Jesus, as the eternal Word of the Father, is sent to inaugurate the Kingdom of God, to save people from their sins. + Jesus commissions his disciples:

“Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 29:19)

Where Do Disciples Learn to do What Jesus Commanded? +

The parish is the place where disciples are gathered together for the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist. The parish initiates the Christian people into Jesus' mission; gathers them together in celebration, teaches Jesus' saving doctrine, practices the charity and love of Jesus in good works and love, and empowers disciples to do the same, living out the Gospel.

Theme for the Year: Getting to Know Jesus

Discipleship Training Format: One Sunday Session and One Monday Session per month.

Sunday Discipleship Sessions

- + Typically will be on the first Sunday of the Month (A complete schedule will follow)
- + Sunday Sessions are always from 10:00 a.m.-12:30 p.m. and either begin with Mass or end with Mass depending upon location.
- + ALL of our parish family is involved, age appropriate sessions will take place during Sunday sessions and include an adult component to them.
- + Location of sessions will vary between Holy Family Site and St. Ambrose Site.
- + All youth enrolled in our Discipleship Training Program, (religious education) will be expected to attend Mass and class with their family on these Sundays.
- + An entire parish Discipleship Event will take place at the beginning of Advent and Lent. Monday Night Discipleship Sessions
- + Families and children, once a month, will attend a Discipleship session on Monday evening
- + Sessions will begin with prayer experience, adult family members will accompany their child to the session to participate in the prayer experience together.
- + After the prayer experiences, children will be dismissed for Grade appropriate Disciple Classes, and Adults will be formed in the church on how to share and practice faith with their families, as well as discussion on faith topics..
- + Monday Discipleship Sessions are divided between two Monday nights depending upon grade level, Grades 1-4 will take place one Monday day a month, and Grades 5-10 will take place on a different Monday
- + Child care will be available for both Sunday and Monday sessions for those adults who would like to participate fully in the adult sessions.

Discipleship Training Program Expectations

1. Our Parish will pray together, that we will grow in learning and understanding our role as disciples and that our Discipleship Training will be successful.
2. Being enrolled in the program means we take our call to discipleship seriously. Weekly Mass attendance and participation is expected.

3. Adults and youth will pray together.
4. Only 3 absences will be allowed in our Discipleship program for a **non-sacramental** year.
5. Only 2 absences will be allowed in our Discipleship program for a **sacramental year**.
6. Having a child enrolled in Catholic School **does not exempt them** from attending our Parish Discipleship training program. Families with children in Catholic school that are registered at Our Lady of Charity are expected to participate in this program from September thru May. The Parish a child is enrolled in, is responsible for the faith formation of that child and we journey together as a parish family.
7. To receive a Sacrament at Our Lady of Charity, a child **MUST** be registered in our Discipleship Training Program.
8. Attendance at both the Sunday Session and Monday Session is expected for the completion of the Discipleship Program Year.
9. This program will empower families to build a stronger ability to share faith at home, pray together and grow together. Families must be willing to try new ways of growing.

Is the parish helping me to become a better disciple? July 16-17

This was the first focus question mentioned in last week's bulletin, so it's only appropriate that we begin here. As a parish family, where we as disciples gather, we must grow together in faith and in answering YES to Jesus' call in our life.

Ultimately, the goal of every parish is to bring people to an encounter with Jesus, teaching them how to be a better disciple. How that has been done has changed through the years, some ways have worked better than others, but the church as a whole must always continue to improve at passing on the faith. The parish must be the center of disciple learning, where we help all people, in all phases of life to know Jesus in their own situations. Our Lady of Charity Parish must be the place where people know they can develop their relationship with Jesus. We must accompany parents, not just before baptism, but throughout the raising of their children. We must show newly married couples how to live as disciples in their married life. We must support those disciples at our parish who are single young adults questioning their faith, or just showing up.

We, as a church, have not always been good at doing this, and we must get better. This process will take time, but we must begin somewhere. This week's edition of our **Discipleship Manual** will look at ways in which we are working to improve the way we do things, beginning with faith formation.

Program at Our Lady of Charity Parish

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- + ALL of our parish family is involved, age appropriate sessions will take place during Sunday sessions and include an adult component to them.
- + Location of sessions will vary between Holy Family Site and St. Ambrose Site.

Monday Night Discipleship Sessions

- + Families and children, once a month, will attend a Discipleship session on Monday evening
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Discipleship Training Program Topical Format Discipleship Learning Topics:

September: Learning what Disciples Do.

October: Learning how to talk about Jesus.

November: Jesus invites us to commit, do we?

December: Share some faith at home, learning how!

January: Growing and Knowing in faith.

February: What's it mean to act like a disciple?

March: Experiencing Jesus' Mercy!

April: Experiencing Hope, Joy, Love!

May: Choosing to Walk with Jesus.

Essentially, disciples do four things:

1. Pray
2. Worship
3. Share faith/evangelize
4. Grow in faith

Our **Discipleship Training Program** will focus our attention in these four areas topically, and give practical help to live our lives as a disciple of Jesus.

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Disciples in Training (D.I.T.) Leaders needed!

We need committed volunteers to help in the many aspects of our new D.I.T. program. Volunteers will receive all of the Discipleship Basic Training that you need to help in this endeavor. Consider these areas:

1. D.I.T. Basic trainer (works with young children)

4. D.I.T. Mentor (Helps lead classroom sessions)
5. Child Care

Disciples Grow

Discipleship Program for...

Adults without Young Disciples

+ This group consists of adults who are single, ... adults who never had children, ... older adults who no longer have children at home,... the more mature adult who might have gray hair.

Sunday Program:

+ Adults will attend Mass together, beginning a deeper awareness of Discipleship. Following Mass, the adult session will develop the thematic topic of the month, in understanding one's role of being a disciple.

+ This is meant for all adults who are looking to deepen their faith and grow in discipleship.

Monday Program:

+ Adults will participate in the shared prayer experience in church.

+ Adults will participate in an adult component of Discipleship Enrichment. The topic will vary based upon time of year, a schedule of specific topics will follow soon.

Young Adults

+ Those who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, ... those finishing high school, ... in college,... starting in the job world,... young couples who may be newly married, ... up to age 40.

Sunday Program:

+ Young adults will attend Mass, participate in large group discussion at the start of the Sunday Discipleship Program.

+ Young adults will then break into their own separate group to discuss faith topics relevant to their state in life

. + The topics will deepen young adult discipleship and bring an awareness of the young adult's choice in following Jesus

Monday Program:

+ Young adults will participate in the shared prayer experience in church.

+ They will break into a small group and continue to develop their discipleship awareness through media, scripture and faith sharing.

Discipleship Program for...

Those Wanting to Become Catholic! Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

+ Anyone who is interested in becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church is welcome to attend these sessions!

Sunday Program:

+ Those interested in becoming Catholic will gather prior to Mass to discuss what it means to become a disciple.

+ Attendance at Mass will be incorporated into the program as you progress in the knowledge of the faith.

+ Sharing sessions will help you to understand what you are seeking by wanting to become a disciple.

+ A team of disciples will share and grow with you as you begin your own journey.

Monday Program:

+ Participation in shared prayer experience in church.

+ Specific discipleship training topics to help you learn the faith, know Jesus, encounter him and choose to walk with him.

Inquiry Sessions Coming Soon

Watch the bulletin for times and places when you will be able to ask questions and get more information about the RCIA Program.

Discipleship Program for Parents and Young Disciples

Parents / Guardians

+ You are the first teachers of the faith to your children, our program is going to help you do that. Sunday Program + Parents / Guardians will attend Mass with their children.

+ Parents / Guardians will have an opportunity to share their own faith experiences, struggles, concerns as well as deepening their own faith.

+ Parents / guardians will learn about their own discipleship and how Jesus is working in their life. Monday Program

+ Parents / Guardians will have a regular opportunity to bring their children for prayer in church. The first 15 minutes will be a prayer experience for children and their parents / guardians together.

+ Parents / Guardians will also learn what their children are learning, and how to support the lesson at home.

Young Disciples

+ Young Disciples need support to grow in the faith and to recognize the Holy Spirit at work in their lives. The Discipleship Program will help you know why Jesus loves you, and why you need to allow Jesus into your life.

Sunday Program

+ Young Disciples will attend Mass with their family

+ Young Disciples will learn a specific trait of being a disciple of Jesus, with their Family. Then they will break out into age appropriate groups to talk about how to grow as a disciple.

Monday Program

+ Young disciples will attend a prayer experience with their parent/guardian. +Young disciples will be dismissed after the prayer experience into Grade appropriate classes to learn about our faith and Jesus.

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Knowing... 'Following' Jesus

Do we know Jesus? Would we recognize him if he was in our midst? To be a disciple of Jesus we have to know the One who we are following. Our technological world today even utilizes the term 'followers'.

If we can follow each other on [Facebook](#), [Instagram](#), [Twitter](#), [Snapchat](#) and get information in an instant on the internet ('Google it'), we need to ask ourselves how much effort do we put into following Jesus?

Take note... here are some interesting facts... While the U.S. did not lead global markets in terms of amount of time spent on social media networks, it was far and away the highest consumer of monthly data, spending the most time per day on their phones with a staggering 4.7 hours. Considering that the average American is awake for just over 15 hours a day (seeing as we sleep for an average of eight hours and 42 minutes), this means that we spend approximately a third of our time on our phones. Sure, using your smartphone isn't mutually exclusive with completing other activities, but still, 4.7 hours is a significant chunk of the day. So do yourself a favor and try to unplug from that tiny little screen for awhile. You may be surprised at how much more you can accomplish with an extra few undistracted hours in your day.

And, just so we don't blame our young people, the study reported that highest compulsive use of social media was with adults between the age of 25-54, who check social media 17 times per day. How about trying this for a single day... saying a prayer every time we check social media, or read the newspaper, or go on the internet, or click on the TV? Think that will help us "Know Jesus?"

Grade 10 Confirmation Preparation

Sophomore (or Junior) students who wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation must be:

- registered in Our Lady of Charity Parish;

- registered and participating in our Discipleship Training Program;
- attend scheduled family day programs on the first Sunday of each month;
- attend 10th grade faith formation classes on the last Monday of each month (unless otherwise noted);
- attend a Confirmation retreat (to be scheduled for August 2017);
- attend 2-3 preparatory classes in August 2017 specific to Confirmation; · participate in class service projects to be determined during class;
- turn in all appropriate paperwork and information necessary as required by the Diocese of Buffalo.

Important New Information

- Candidates for Confirmation will be in their junior year of high school;
- The sacrament of Confirmation will not be offered until the fall of 2017 and then in the fall of each year. There will be no spring Confirmation;
- Candidates must attend 10th grade faith formation classes as well as the requirements listed above in order to be confirmed at OLCP.

“Excuse me, I’m looking for Jesus. Can you help me?” (September 17-18)

What if someone came to you and asked you that question. What would you say? How would you describe Jesus? As we begin our Discipleship Training Program we are going to work at growing in faith together, at becoming better disciples. This first question will form our Discipleship Training for the month of September. Our faith formation classes will focus on this question, and each age level will learn different aspects of who Jesus is, from knowing Jesus as a human being, to knowing Jesus as the Son of God, to knowing Jesus as a personal friend. All of us, during this month, are asked to ponder and perhaps even meditate on the question above.

So, here are some suggestions to help us to grow and enter into the conversation for Discipleship Training for September. I encourage you, give it a try.

- 1. On the way to and from church have a conversation with your car mates. Ask the question “How would you help someone find Jesus?”, or “How would you describe Jesus?”**
- 2. Place a sheet of paper on the kitchen table, write the name ‘Jesus’ in the middle and each day, have anyone who enters your kitchen write one descriptive characteristic or quality they would use to**

describe Jesus. At the end of each week in September review those qualities with your family/friends and circle the one that speaks to you.

3. Choose one friend a day and write the quality that you love about your friend. Choose a different friend, or family member, each day if possible (you can use a person more than once if you'd like). During September, keep track of those qualities and at the end of the month, see if those combined qualities would be a good description of Jesus.

Please continue to pray for the success of our Parish, and our Discipleship Training Program. If you need child care during the adult session, just call and let us know so we can prepare.
